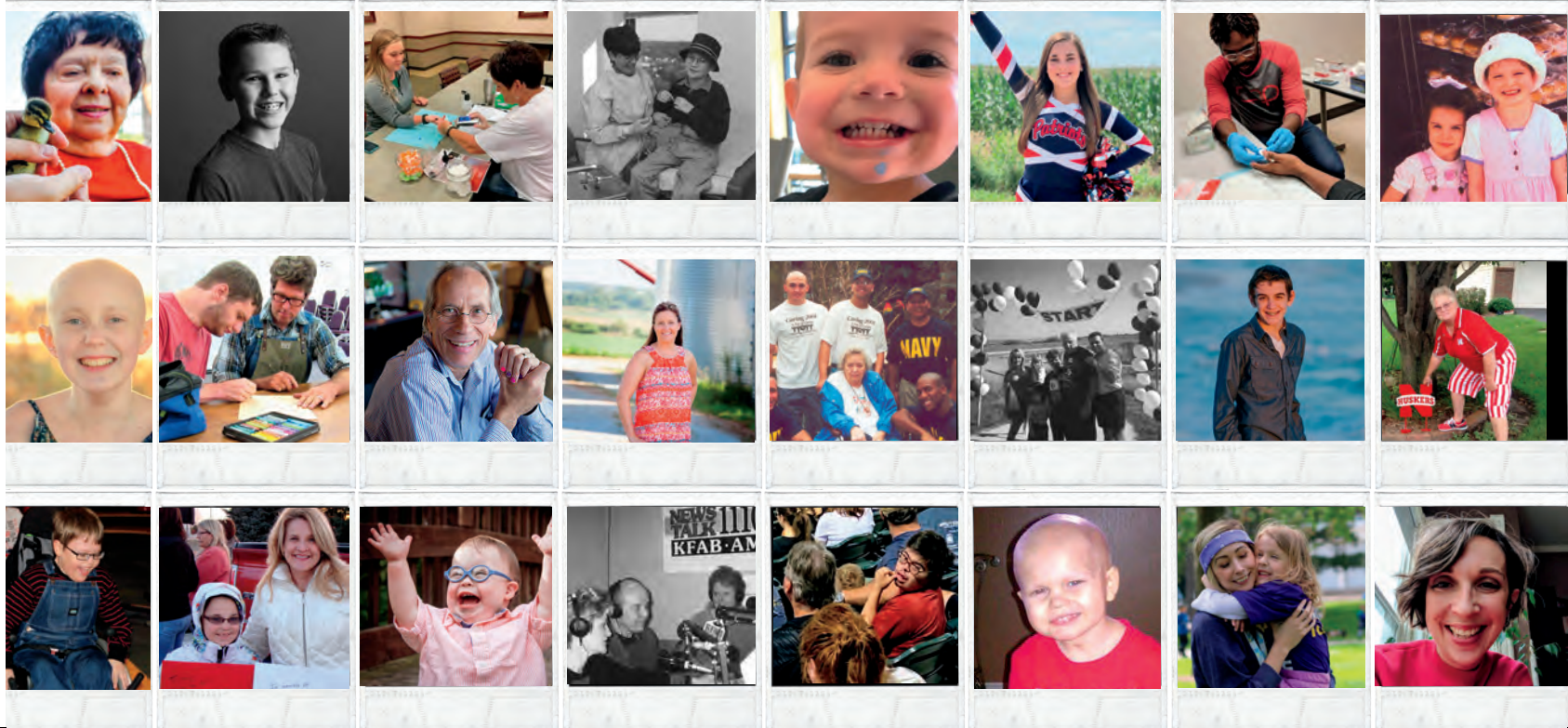

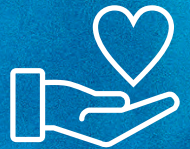

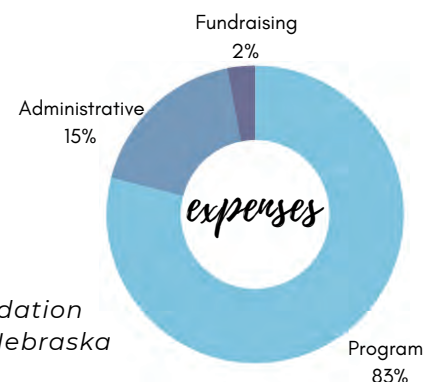

## BLUE CROSS AND BLUE SHIELD OF NEBRASKA SUPPORTS CHAD THROUGH HEALTH OF NEBRASKA SPONSORSHIP

For more than 80 years, Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Nebraska (BCBSNE) has offered security and stability to its members faced with medical expenses. Through its Health of Nebraska initiative, BCBSNE seeks to support programs that address social determinants of health and health equity.

Thanks to their support, 7,696 Nebraskans (and counting!) were directly impacted by this sponsorship over the last year. This year's funding helped to create or expand direct programming with nine member agencies. Additionally, five member agencies received support for their signature events across the state, with three of these events raising over \$1.1 million for critical programming, resources and medical research. Six more member agency recipients were awarded funding for their respective missions and general operating support. BCBSNE's investment through the Health of Nebraska sponsorship continues to affect real change with patients and their families in communities across the state, all while supporting the missions of CHAD and its 23 member agencies.

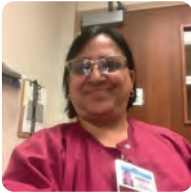

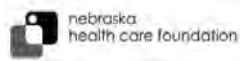


### PROGRAMMING AND EDUCATION

During the holiday season, Nebraska AIDS Project was able to provide food vouchers for 396 of its clients and families. It also provided holiday gifts for 64 children of people living with AIDS across the state.



### CAMPS AND FAMILY EVENTS

*9 agencies host children and families at camps and events to empower their constituents and loved ones. These build a sense of community and often result in lifelong learning and friendships.*



The Arthritis Foundation of Nebraska reaches hundreds of children and families across the state with annual summer camps and family day events, providing education, resources and networking opportunities.



### VITAL RESEARCH

*9 agencies continue to fund and secure better screenings, treatments and prevention to reach the goal of a cure.*

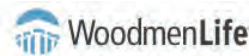

# 2021 CHAD HEALTH CHAMPION



The 2021 CHAD Health Champion Award was presented to Heath Boddy, former president and CEO of the Nebraska Health Care Association (NHCA), and a CHAD member agency, Nebraska Health Care Foundation (NHCF).

Heath has been an outspoken advocate for CHAD, frequently speaking to groups about CHAD and being a leadership contributor in the Lincoln United Way/CHAD campaign.

In 2020, he issued a personal challenge to the NHCA team—donate more than the previous year and he and his wife, Karma, would add an extra \$500. The team responded by donating more than 10 percent over the previous year, resulting in a team total that was 22 percent over 2019.

During the pandemic, under Boddy's leadership, the NHCA and NHCF partnered to source over 250,000 pieces of PPE for health care facilities across the state.

CHAD was a proud partner in these efforts, helping to collect donations of more than 15,000 masks.

Heath left NHCA to become Chief Business Development Officer for Vetter Health Services, a nonprofit organization providing services and living options for rehabilitation, independent living, assisted living, and skilled nursing care across Nebraska, Kansas, Iowa, Missouri, and Wyoming. They employ over 3300 team members. Boddy has since been promoted to COO.
