What's old is new again!



CHAD (Combined Health Agencies Drive) is a local, donor-designation driven organization that has been raising funds for Nebraska’s premier health charities since 1972. Valuable donations help Nebraskans in need by providing care and support for those affected by a health diagnosis; funding education and prevention programs in our communities; and supporting advocacy and medical research. Donors who give during our statewide campaign ensure our 21 member charities are funded on a consistent basis; 100% of donor-designated dollars go directly to full-member charities. Since 1972, we have raised \$58,159,054, and 90 cents of every dollar donated to CHAD went to support our mission.

Planning for the Future

CHAD staff took part in our annual strategic planning session. During the session, we planned for our rebrand by reviewing our mission, vision and brand. We also discussed strategic goals for our organization that let us best serve our volunteers, company partners, donors and member charities.

Our rebrand was official July 1, 2019. 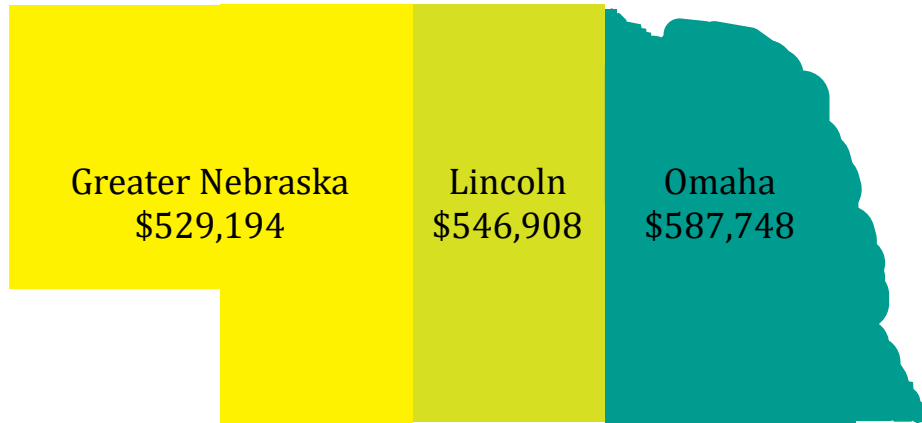

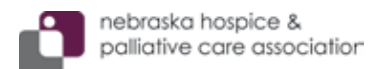


Advocacy

- In partnership with their national organizations, 14 of our member charities funded **\$892,374,569 of medical research** for diagnostic tools, better treatment options and ultimately a cure.
